

The Confluence Project: The Confluence Project is an initiative to reclaim, transform and re-imagine seven places along the historic Columbia River Basin, through permanent art installations by Maya Lin. Fairview Elementary School students were included via the Confluence competitive grant process.

Confluence in the Schools: Fairview Elementary Legacy Pathway

As part of the **Confluence Project**, *Fairview Elementary and Reynolds High School Students* created basalt petroglyphs representing local flora, fauna, and Native culture as documented in the Lewis & Clark journals. These petroglyphs can be seen at the starred locations. #1: Fairview Elementary School, 225 Main St., Fairview, OR; #2: Lakeshore Park located off of Fairview Lake Way and NE 217th Avenue; #3: Heslin House, N.E. 223rd and Main St., Fairview, OR; #4: Fairview Community Park, immediately south of Fairview City Hall, 1300 N.E. Village Street, Fairview, OR; #5: Donald L. Robertson City Park, N.E. Halsey and N.E. 243rd Sts., Wood Village, OR, and #6: Glenn Otto Community Park, 1102 E. Historic Columbia River Hwy., Troutdale, OR. In addition, we are honored to have on the Sandy River Delta one of the seven Maya Lin Confluence art installations in the form of a bird blind. It is labeled at the top right of the map; while visiting, please respect the areas off limits to dogs, and the areas where dogs are allowed on leash only. Thank you!
